Important Items to Look for on Your Tax Bill

Do you have a Lottery Credit? Check your tax bill. If you lived in your home as of January 1st 2010 and it was your primary residence, you should receive a Lottery Credit. You can claim a Lottery Credit at the Town Hall until January 31, 2011, and with the County Treasurer by July 31, 2011, and the State of Wisconsin until October 1, 2011.

In mid-December property owners will be receiving their tax bills. The **First Dollar Credit** is a credit given by the state to every parcel of real property with an improvement.

The Drainage District Notification will be listed on every parcel of land that falls within a drainage district. The Town of Norway has two drainage districts. The majority of the Town is in the Norway-Dover Drainage District and three hundred acres of Norway is in the Waterford Farm Drainage District. The Racine County Drainage Commission sets assessments for all of the drainage districts in Racine County. Neither district has imposed an assessment this year.

Information on Assessment Value, Assessment Ratio, and the Fair Market

Garbage Containers - If it is snowing and the snow plows are working on garbage pick-up days, please place your garbage containers in your driveway, NOT in the roadway or on a snow bank. This way the plows will not damage your containers or scatter garbage, and we can do a better job of snow removal.

Winter Parking - The Town's ordinance prohibits parking on all town roads and

Value. The **Assessment Value** is the value placed by the Town's Assessor. Most Assessment changes occur only when the Town does a total reassessment of all property in the township or when an addition has been made to your property. The Assessment Value is what the assessment was on your parcel as of January 1, 2010. The Assessment Value is used to figure the Tax amount for that parcel.

The **Assessment Ratio** is calculated by the Department of Revenue by tracking the sale price of homes sold during 2009.

Yes, 2009. The Dept. of Revenue calculates the ratio between the sale price and assessed value of that parcel.

That brings us to the **Fair Market Value.** Fair Market Value is calculated by taking your Total Assessment Value and dividing it by the Assessment Ratio. This does NOT reflect what the Market Price is. The Fair Market Value reflects your portion of the Town Equalized Value. Equalized Value is used to calculate the Town portion of School Taxes and County Taxes at the local level.

New Ordinance Snow Emergencies "5.03 Parking and Other Limitations Snow Emergencies

A. Whenever the accumulation of snow within a twenty-four

(24) hour period exceeds four (4) inches as measured on the level at the Town of Norway Department of Public Works Building, 4021 E Wind Lake Rd., Union Grove WI, the Town Chair or his/her designee or the Town Administrator or his/her designee is authorized to declare a snow emergency.

B. Once a snow emergency has been declared, the Chair, Town Administrator or his/her designee will notify radio stations WTMJ and WISN and Television Channels 4, 6, 12, and 58 with

the request to broadcast the snow emergency.

C. One hour after the radio and television stations are notified, parking on any town road is prohibited. The police may cause to be removed any vehicle parked thereon that impedes the operation of the Department of Public Works in dealing with the snow emergency. However, at least one-half hour before removal of the vehicle, a reasonable effort shall be made to notify the vehicle owner or an adult member of the household, either by phone or in person, that removal is required."

1. That Section 5.03(4) of the Code of Ordinances for the Town of Norway be, and hereby is, renumbered to read as follows:

"5.03 Parking and Other Limitations

(5) Penalty

Upon conviction, any person who violates the parking limitation or snow emergency in 5.03 Ord. shall pay a forfeiture of not less than fifty (\$50) nor more than one hundred (\$100) fees, assessments, costs of towing and storage and in default of payment may be imprisoned in the county jail for up to ninety (90) days."

Dog Licensing

We are coming into tax time. As you pay your property taxes, remember to license your dog(s) for 2011. Tags will be here mid-December. As long as the information we have on file is current, you need only to pay for the new tag(s). Talking about animals – when you exercise your pet by walking along the road, remember to clean up the 'gifts' your pet leaves behind. This also applies to horses being exercised along a town road. Thanks to everyone for being responsible pet owners.

Blowing Snow Into Roads

Talking about clean up - after a snow fall, remember to keep your snow on your property and not shovel or snow blow it into the road.

Zoning & Building Permits

The recent election showed that the Town of Norway has people who care, are aware of their surroundings and needs and will speak up to protect their surroundings. Therefore, it came as a large surprise to learn that the Town of Norway also has many people doing building/remodeling projects without benefit of zoning and building permits and without building inspection. Racine County Planning thinks this is great, on the one hand, as they get to charge double permit fees when offenders are caught but they would prefer to deal with you upfront and before the fact. Message from the Chair *by Jean Jacobson*

The **Town of Norway** 2011 Budget of \$3,136,755 was adopted after the public hearing on November 17th. Once again, the budget keeps expenses at a minimum and the tax rate, which will remain the same, will be one of the lowest in Racine County. The levy was increased by .03%. It has become increasingly difficult to keep expenses at a minimum with rising costs, but we are always looking for more efficient ways to provide services to our residents. As the State of Wisconsin deals with their budget crisis, we will actively participate in discussions that concern town government.

Some items in the budget are beyond our control. For instance, **all highway signs** need to be replaced. This includes street signs. The US Department of Transportation has decided to change the size and reflectivity of all signs. The size and use of large and small lettering has also been changed. The Town of Norway can not afford to do such a project all at once. Our staff will be replacing street signs as needed. They will concentrate on replacing all stop signs in a timely manner. Stop signs will now require another sign ahead of it that conforms to the international standard. This new sign warns a motorist that there is a stop sign ahead.

There is a **new salt shed** being constructed at the highway garage on Hwy K and Hwy S. The new shed should provide a much larger facility for salt storage and allow the town to purchase a larger amount of salt at a cheaper price. The savings will help pay the cost of the new shed.

Next summer, activities in the park should

increase with the construction of **two new park shelters**. The concrete pads have been poured and construction of these structures will take place over the winter. Electricity will be provided in the shelters for picnics and entertainment and the shelters can be reserved for private use. Those interested in making reservations can contact Megan Farber, the town Recreation Coordinator, after the first of the year.

I would like to personally thank members of our Town Board for using their professional construction expertise this year in many ways. We have several projects underway and their knowledge has saved the town dollars in many ways. Thanks to Bob, Mike, Tim, and Ralph. Thanks to the Norway Garden Club for the plantings around the town hall, and to the UW/Extension Master Gardeners for the wonderful meadow garden in Meyer Park. Also, thanks to the many to the volunteers who continue to provide sports programs for our youths.

November's election was a busy event at the Town Hall. Thanks to all the poll workers and town staff for taking care of everyone in a timely manner. My favorite saying is "**The World is Run by Those Who Show Up.**" There were 3,839 voters who "showed up" to cast their vote on November 2nd. As always, the exact tally of votes cast are available from the Town Clerk.

The Town of Norway helped re-elect Rep. Robin Vos as our State Representative, 63rd District. Van Wanggaard was elected as our new State Senator, 21st District. The Town of Norway officials will work closely with both of these State officials as the new

State Budget is being developed. Town and county budgets are greatly affected by state funding. Contact information for all of our elected officials is available in the Town Clerk's office.

There is a **new recycling law regarding electronic equipment**. Many families will be updating electronic equipment over the holidays. It is important to be informed regarding disposal of things that are no longer needed. Please read the article elsewhere in this newsletter to learn about proper disposal of electronics.

The Wind Lake Chamber of Commerce held its first **Farmers Market** at the Town Hall this summer, featuring flowers, baked goods, local produce and goodies. They have indicated that they plan make this a yearly event for our community. Thanks to everyone for supporting this project.

Thanks to the **Wind Lake Lions Club** for helping with **Santa's Winter Wonderland**. They have provided Christmas stockings each year and most of all, made sure that Santa arrives on time. Excited young children dressed in their holiday finery get to visit Santa and do fun things. Even if you don't have children to bring this year, it is worth the trip to the town hall, just to remind yourself what Christmas is all about.

On behalf of the Town Board, I would like to wish our residents a **Happy Thanksgiving and a very Merry Christmas**. These past few years have been difficult for many due to economic conditions and let's hope that the New Year brings good things to many families.

Electronics Recycling

Wisconsin's electronics recycling law, 2009 Wisconsin Act 50, was signed into law by Governor Doyle in October 2009. The law established a collection and recycling system in Wisconsin for certain consumer electronic devices discarded by households, K-12 public schools and Milwaukee Parental Choice Program schools. This is now called the E-Cycle Wisconsin program.

The law also enacted a disposal ban that restricts landfilling or incineration of these devices as of September 1, 2010. The following electronics are covered in the ban and are recyclable:

- **Desktop computers**
- **Computer peripherals, including:** Keyboards, mice, hard drives, canners, speakers, flash drives, external modems and other devices
- **Desktop printers**, including printers combined with fax machines,
- **Video display devices** of at least 7" long in the longest diagonal dimension. These include TVs,
- **Fax machines**
- * **DVD players, VCRs, DVRs and cell phones**

This ban covers everyone in the state, and applies no matter where a device was purchased or who used it. Households, schools, businesses, governments and institutions are all covered under the ban.

Instead of throwing away electronics, households, businesses and others should recycle them. Households and schools can recycle many of their electronics through E-Cycle Wisconsin. Go to the DNR website dnr.wi.gov/ecyclewisconsin for more information and a list of collection locations across the state.

Snow Plowing Information *from Jean Jacobson, Town Chair*

Different municipalities are responsible for road maintenance, which includes plowing, within our township. All roads that have names are the responsibility of the Town of Norway. This would include Loomis Road, South Wind Lake Road, Hanson Road, etc., and subdivision roads. Within our township, there are a number of private roads that are the responsibility of the property owners. A private contractor is hired to maintain and plow private roads, and property owners are billed each year for the cost.



Racine County is responsible for all the roads that are assigned a letter. These include Highway S, K, and Y. The roads that are assigned a number, such as Highways 36, 20, and 164, are the responsibility of the State of Wisconsin. The state contracts with Racine County each year to maintain these roads. This includes snowplowing.

Our snowplow drivers do their best to clear the roads each year, sometimes in very difficult conditions, however, because all the snowplows are orange, it is sometimes confusing to the public which municipality oversees the operations. There is a coordinated effort in severe weather to plow roads each year, and it takes a great deal of preparation and training.

If you have difficulties or questions regarding a Town of Norway road, you can contact the Town Hall at 895-6335. Questions regarding a Racine County road or a state highway can be referred to Racine County Public Works at 262-886-8440. In an emergency, a call can be placed to the Racine County Sheriff's Department at 262-895-6211 or 911.

Reminder to All Pet Owners

Our animal warden often receives calls regarding dog owners who walk their dogs along the road and refuse to pick up after them. Carrying a plastic bag with you is all that is needed to take care of this problem.

Some residents have also complained to the Clerk's Office that they feel unsafe at times while walking through their neighborhood. There have been a few instances where dogs will leave their own property and run into the road causing an encounter with people who are walking by with children or pets.

It is the responsibility of the pet owner to keep your pet on your property or on a leash while walking.

A fine of up to \$250.00 can be issued to those who do not pick up after their animal or allow their pet to roam.

Please be considerate of your neighbors and help keep our community clean. Being a responsible pet owner is not only advantageous to your neighborhood but a safety and health issue for your pet as well.

Temporary Structures, Poly Structures and Poly Shelters *by Dave Hendrix Building Inspector*

In a previous newsletter article I discussed temporary structures, poly structures and poly shelters. These structures are not allowed without a Racine County zoning permit and a Town of Norway building permit. Please review your property to ensure compliance with this ordinance.

In January 2011, the Community Service Dept. will begin to enforce this ordinance. If you are not in compliance, you will receive a letter giving you 30 days to remove the structure or obtain all necessary permits. If you cannot meet this deadline, you will have 5 days to request a hearing

with the Town Board. If you fail to follow these options, you will receive a citation. In the new year, if you are going to do any building including sheds, pole buildings etc., please remember to apply for a County Zoning Permit and a Town Building Permit before the project is started.

Stories of how hair will not break down and ball up causing plugs were also related. And of course everyone's favorite topic of chlorides that pass through the treatment facility have been told over and over. We have now discovered a new culprit causing grief.

One of the newest helpers in our hectic rush around world is the instant wipe. They are used for a variety of purposes from wiping baby butts to dusting the house to

disinfecting everything imaginable. Some of the ads say "Just use them and flush them away!" The people who write those snappy jingles don't have to deal with them after there "flushed away," I do. We have been running the camera through the sewer mains in search of leaks and other problems and we have seen many of these wipes laying in the pipes and not going with the flow. Snowmobile Safety Certification Class Offered



The Wind Lake/North Cape Drifters Snowmobile Club will hold their Snowmobile Safety Certification Course this year on December 7th, 9th, and 11th at the Norway Town Hall, located on Heg Park Rd. Class sessions on Tuesday and Thursday will be held from 6:00pm-9:00pm, while Saturday's session will be held from 8:00am-11:00am.

Anyone who was born on or after January 1st, 1985 must be certified in order to operate a snowmobile alone. A snowmobiler who does not turn 26 years old before January 1st, 2011, must take a safety class!

Students will be taught snowmobile laws along with how to operate snowmobiles

Keep Your Kids Safe

Kids need to know how to keep themselves safe and knowing this will build the self-confidence they need to handle emergencies effectively. You can make sure your children are prepared by teaching them how to act in an emergency and planning ahead.

Make sure kids know their full name, parents' full names, address (including city and state), and phone number (including area code).

Explain to kids that an emergency is a situation where they need the help of a police officer, firefighter, or doctor. Discuss or role-play different situations and ask children to identify the emergencies.

Teach children to call 911 or 0 in an emergency and explain that this will bring a police officer or firefighter to the emergency. With a play phone or one

that's disconnected, have children practice dialing 911 or 0 and telling the "operator" their emergency, full name, full address, and telephone number. Have children also practice dialing on a cell phone that's turned off.

Talk with kids about what to do when they need help if it's not an emergency, such as if they are home alone and have a headache.

Make sure your children know how to reach you at all times, and be sure that you can reach them.

Post emergency numbers by the phone, including your work and cell phone numbers.

With your children, pick a safe place they can go to near your home if they need help right away.



Find an alternative place your children can go if they cannot reach home, such as a school, library, fire station, or other safe place.

Students who have completed other DNR safety courses will already have this number. There is no cost to get this number.
